

MEDICAL SCHOOLS PREREQUISITE COURSES TIME LINE

This time line includes the pre-medical course requirements for Texas and most U. S. medical schools.

These courses are also preparatory for the MCAT.

Six semesters or longer, regardless of the student's age or year in college, are generally required to complete the pre-medical courses and extra-curricular activities.

Many students finish prerequisites in Year 4 or later and have a bridge year or years.

This bridge from undergraduate to medical school is an opportunity to become more competitive for admission and better prepared for the rigors of professional education, training, and professional life.
