PRE-MATCH OFFERS

Medical schools may extend pre-match offers of acceptance to Texas residents between **November 15**th and **December 31**st.

- An applicant may receive and may accept multiple pre-match offers during this period.
- Accepting multiple pre-match offers during this period does not affect the possibility of offers from other medical schools.
- An applicant who receives more than one offer should decline any offer from a school that he/she definitely does not plan to attend as soon as that decision is made.

Two factors are involved in the match:

- 1. the applicants' ranking of the schools
- 2. the **schools' ranking** of the applicants
- An applicant must be ranked within a schools' selection range to be matched to that school.
- The schools have no knowledge of the applicants' rankings.

MATCH PROCESS

- The regular match is conducted to confirm the pre-match offers applicants are holding and to fill the remaining slots for the medical schools.
- By 5:00 pm on January 21st, any applicant who interviewed at one or more schools **must** submit their match preference rank of **all** schools where they interviewed.
- All schools at which an applicant interviewed must be ranked, regardless of whether or not a pre-match offer was received.

- Applicants holding a pre-match offer who have interviewed at school(s) that did not extend an offer may rank one or more of those schools higher than the pre-match offer school without risk of losing the pre-match offer.
- If an applicant holds a pre-match offer and <u>matches</u> to a higher ranked school, the pre-match offer will be automatically withdrawn. Pre-match offers will also be withdrawn from all other lower ranked schools.

The applicant will remain open to be selected by schools ranked higher than the school matched to.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Once you have entered your match preference rank, be sure to print a copy of your rankings for your reference. Once the deadline passes, the [School Preference Rank] page will no longer be accessible.
- Any applicant that does not enter their match preference rank by the deadline, will be automatically withdrawn from all schools (regardless of whether or not they hold a pre-match offer).

SCENARIOS

Applicant James applies to all TMDSAS medical schools. He is fortunate enough to interview with five of the schools.

He receives and accepts three pre-match offers - from Schools A, B, and C.

He realizes that School A is not his top choice. Therefore, he notifies School A immediately by email that he has decided to decline their offer.


James is now holding a spot at Schools B and C.

As the January 21st deadline approaches, he could choose to rank one of his pre-match offers as #1, which would eliminate the rest of the schools. He weighs his options and decides to rank the schools as follows:



SCENARIO 1

James matched to #3 School B, one of the schools he received a pre-match offer from.



SCENARIO 2

James matched to #2 School E, one of the schools he did not receive a pre-match offer from.
